

Descriptive Summary

Abstract: Compiled by Weaver and acquired upon his departure from the Arnold Arboretum, the papers of Richard Edwin Weaver consist of manuscripts, correspondence, plant lists, and records of plant expeditions. During his tenure, from 1970 until 1983, Weaver held various positions including horticultural taxonomist and acting director. Weaver worked closely with the Living Collections Department, directing planting for many years and organizing several collecting expeditions. Maintained in the alphabetical system he utilized, this collection contains a great deal of correspondence.

Provenance: The Richard E. Weaver, Jr. papers were transferred into the archives upon Dr. Weaver's departure from the Arnold Arboretum in 1983. With the exception of a small amount of material consisting mainly of images added to Box 2, 3, Biographical Description, the files remain as they were in the alphabetical arrangement organized by Richard E. Weaver, Jr. In 2013, Sheila Connor donated 28 photographs she took of Weaver's We-Du Nursery in 1985. These photographs were added to the "Photographs" folder.

Biographical Note



Richard E. Weaver, Jr. was born in Richland, Pennsylvania in 1943. In 1965, he received his B.S. in Education from Millersville State College in Millersville, PA and his M.A. in Plant Taxonomy from Duke University in 1968. He continued studying taxonomic botany at Duke earning his doctorate in 1970 with the thesis, "A revision of the neotropical genus *Lisianthius* (Gentianaceae)," which was published in the *Journal of the Arnold Arboretum*. 53:76-100 (1972).

In late 1970, Weaver began his work as a Horticultural Taxonomist/Assistant Curator for the Arnold Arboretum. He worked under the directorship of Richard Howard, and alongside taxonomist Stephen A. Spongberg and horticulturalist Gary Koller. With Weaver joining the staff, the study of ligneous genera of eastern North America and eastern Asia was revived.

As Assistant Curator, Weaver worked closely with the Living Collections, playing a key role in shaping the grounds, and directing the planting for several seasons. One of his many duties was to respond to plant information inquiries. He did so for the duration of his Arnold Arboretum tenure.

Weaver organized and carried out several plant collecting trips, the first from 1971 to 1972, to collect tropical species of Gentianaceae in Colombia and Venezuela. He then collected in Korea and Japan with Stephen A. Spongberg in 1977 and in the Soviet Union as part of the Cary Arboretum's reciprocal program in 1981. He also taught many Arnold Arboretum classes as well as Harvard University Summer School courses in plant taxonomy. Besides his interest in temperate woody genera, Weaver's botanical research centered on the Neotropical members of the Gentianaceae, and he published several articles on the group during his tenure.

He was intimately involved with the Arboretum's publication <u>Arnoldia</u>, contributing numerous articles to the magazine and serving as editor. From July 1, 1977 through September 30, 1978, during the hiatus between the Richard A. Howard and Peter Shaw Ashton Arboretum directorships, Weaver served as Acting Director of the Jamaica Plain and Weston segments of the Arboretum. Weaver was also a driving force and the project manager in the Restoration of the Living Collections, an ambitious plan to re-establish as far as practical the original Bentham and Hooker arrangement of the living collections, to acquire over a five year period all taxa listed in Alfred Rehder's *Manual of Cultivated Trees and Shrubs* not then present in the Living Collections, and to renovate and develop the plantings along the C.S. Sargent

pathway system, specifically Maple, Willow, Hickory, Ash and Catalpa Paths. (see Archives Office of the Director Master Planning IA-4 1979)

After he left the Arboretum in 1983, Weaver and his partner, Rene Duval, started We-Du Nurseries in Marion, North Carolina. The nursery specialized in wildflowers from eastern

North America and eastern Asia, both areas of horticultural interest to Weaver. In 1996, they sold the nursery and relocated to Puerto Rico where they purchased a coffee finca. In June, 2002, they moved to Florida with Weaver taking a position in the Herbarium of the Division of Plant Industry, Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services.

Scope and Content

Weaver arranged the 108 files in this collection alphabetically. The collection includes manuscripts, correspondence, plant lists, and records of plant expeditions. The majority of the contents include plant information regarding the Arnold Arboretum, R. Weaver's correspondence with colleagues and to those with plant inquiries, and also Arboretum and Case Estate business and work notes.

Arrangement

The Weaver collection is maintained in one series in the order in which it was created, with a few additions by the Archivist. See "Provenance" for details about these additions.




